



# Licence Agreement / Publication Agreement OPUS Siegen

### Attention: NON-LEGALLY BINDING TRANSLATION

The author hereby permits the University Library of the University of Siegen, represented by the Head Library Director, to make his/her work including abstract and metadata available for free use on the Internet under the license conditions/agreements listed below. Within the scope of this provision, users are entitled to use works free of charge in accordance with copyright law, in particular to download the work for private and other personal use, to store it or to print it in small numbers (§53 UrhG).

### Single author

The author assures that he/she is solely entitled to dispose of the copyright rights to use this work and that he/she has not made any dispositions contrary to the rights granted in this agreement. This also applies to the text or image templates supplied by him/her, whose rights of use are with him/her.

#### Several authors

If several authors wrote the work together, they are co-authors of the work. The publication of the work can therefore only take place with the consent of all authors. Alternatively, a responsible editor can agree to the agreement on behalf of all authors.

### Granting of rights

The rights granted by this agreement may be transferred in whole or in part to third parties and simple rights of use may be assigned to other repositories or a third party commissioned to provide the document without the separate consent of the author.

The author grants the University Library the right to make copies of his/her work on paper or electronic storage media to enable users to use it in accordance with §53 UrhG. The author grants the University Library the right to convert the data of his/her work into other data formats if technical developments require this. According to the state of the art, the preservation of original page breaks cannot be guaranteed at present.

The author remains free to dispose of his/her work in any other way (e.g. by granting a Creative Commons licence), provided this does not entail any restriction of the rights of the University Library mentioned in this agreement. The author grants the University Library the right to make the metadata including the abstract of his/her work available to other databases free of charge under the CCO license.

## Responsibilities of the University Library

The University Library undertakes, within the scope of its technical and organizational possibilities, to save the work permanently and to distribute the publication via the Internet. The head library director of the University Library reserves the right to refuse publication. The University Library ensures the integrity of the data during data migrations and data conversions. The University Library strives for continuous availability of its websites on the server operated by it. Within the scope of its technical possibilities, the University Library takes the necessary measures to ensure the integrity of the content of the published work on the Internet.





### Liability

The author confirms with his/her consent that the publication of his/her work on the publicly accessible websites of the University Library and the granting of rights of use to the University Library in accordance with this agreement does not violate the rights of third parties; he/she will indemnify the University Library from any claims by third parties.

The University Library is only liable for intent and gross negligence; it assumes no liability or guarantee if the work is unlawfully downloaded, changed or published elsewhere without the consent of the author. The University Library is entitled to block access to a work if there are concrete indications of a violation of the rights of third parties or if other legal regulations require this.

Insofar as no agreement has been reached on a matter, the statutory regulations shall apply.
