Features & Functionality at a Glance...

1 Breadbox
Selectively remove terms from search string

2 Exposed Limiters
Refine a search without navigating away from the results page

3 Images
Preview thumbnail images from applicable full-text articles and EBSCO's *Image Collection*

4 Date Slide Limiter
Quickly filter results to display a particular date range

5 Sorting Results
Results can be sorted by relevancy or by date

6 Preview Pane
Hover over icons to preview records without leaving the results page

7 Enhanced Clustering
Filter search results by suggested related subject matter

8 Search History
Search history and alerts are found directly above the results list, and search history can be expanded and viewed inline with the results list

9 Folders
Organize articles of interest — articles can be added or removed directly from the results list or from the preview pane

Additional Features...

- **How to Cite** — easy access to detail on how to cite EBSCOhost articles according to various bibliographic formats (AMA, APA, Chicago, MLA, etc.)
- **Display of Limiters** — limiters, expanders and search modes are displayed in two columns, providing more visibility to search options
